ASTEROID AND KUIPER BELTS

Beyond Mars, a huge ring of rocks marks the edge of the inner Solar System. This is called the Asteroid Belt because it contains billions of lumps of metal or rock known as asteroids. The Kuiper Belt stretches from the edge of Neptune's orbit to at least 12 billion kilometers (75 billion miles) from the Sun.

3 ASTEROID BELT FACTS

- The Asteroid belt lies roughly between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter.
- Asteroids in the belt vary from tiny dust through to the dwarf planet Ceres.
- Gravitational forces can throw asteroids out of the belt towards the inner solar system.

Comets are huge lumps of ice which warm, releasing gasses, when they pass close to the sun.

Find the stickers of the comet and Pluto.

3 KUIPER BELT FACTS

- Scientists believe that left-over objects from the Sun and the planets were pushed towards the edge of the solar system by larger planets like Jupiter and Saturn.
- The Kuiper Belt is much larger than the Asteroid Belt and as much as 20 times as wide.
- In addition to rocks and metal, most of the objects on the Kuiper Belt are frozen.

Pluto is a 'dwarf' planet living within the Kuiper Belt. For a long time it was considered to be the ninth planet of the Solar System.

Navigate your spaceship through the Kuiper Belt to reach Pluto.

Chameleon
If there is one true expert in camouflage, it is the chameleon. This species of lizard has the ability to change color so that it can blend in with its surroundings, to reveal its mood, and to communicate with other chameleons. They live in warm habitats in Africa, southern Europe and Southern Asia.

20-20 Vision
Chameleons can move their cone-shaped eyes independently of each other, allowing them to have a 360-degree field of vision. This means they can see in all directions at once.

Legs and tail
The feet of chameleons are highly adapted to living in trees and bushes. Their tails and fingers help them stay balanced.

Fastest Tongue
The chameleon has the potential to extend its sticky tongue up to twice the length of its body unrolling it at an amazing speed. It takes about twenty milliseconds to catch a cricket!

Jackson's Chameleon
Three horns, located on the nose and above each eye, make them look like small Triceratops dinosaurs.

Brookesia micra:
The smallest chameleon species grows only to a length of 0.75 inches.

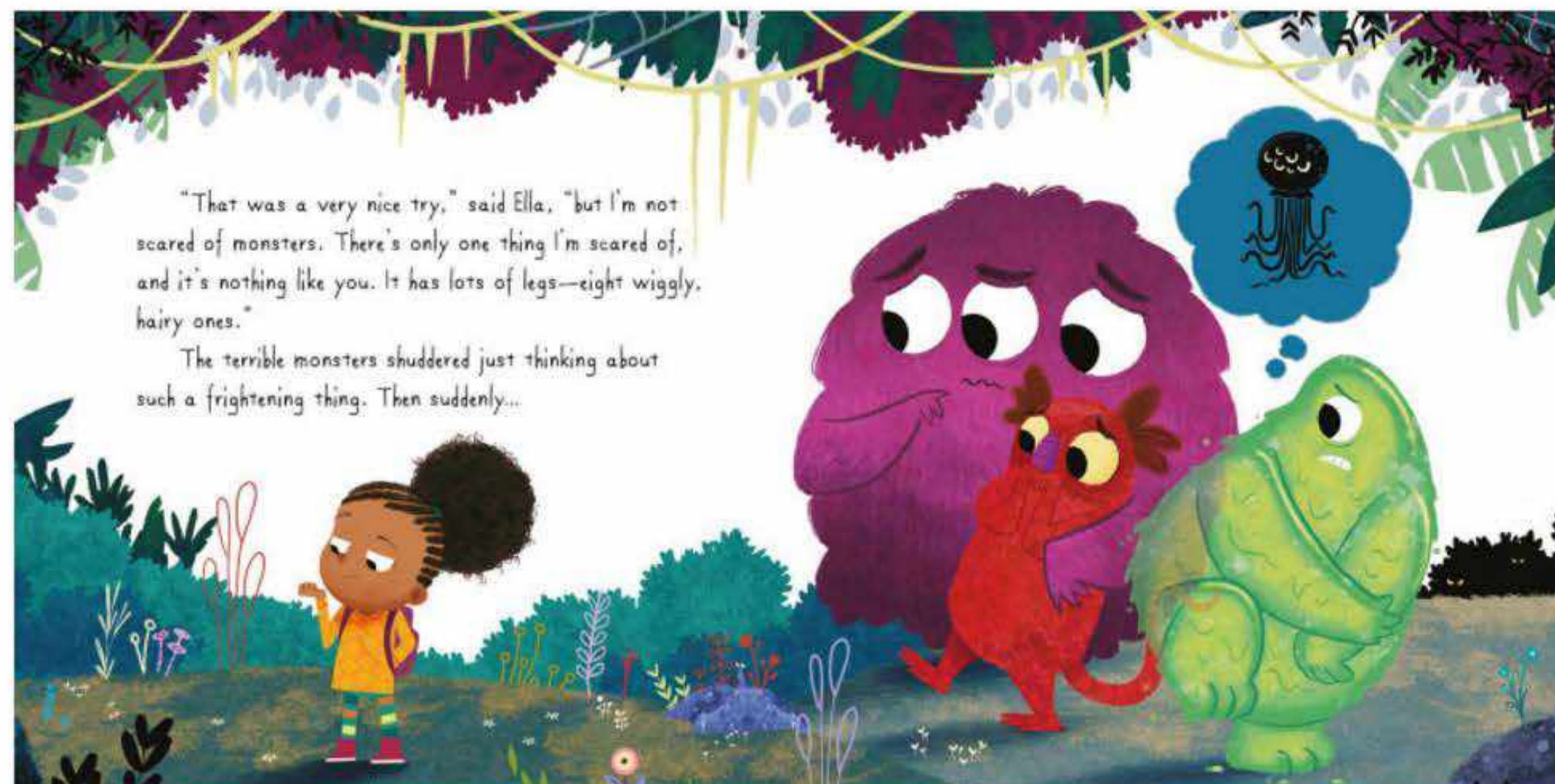
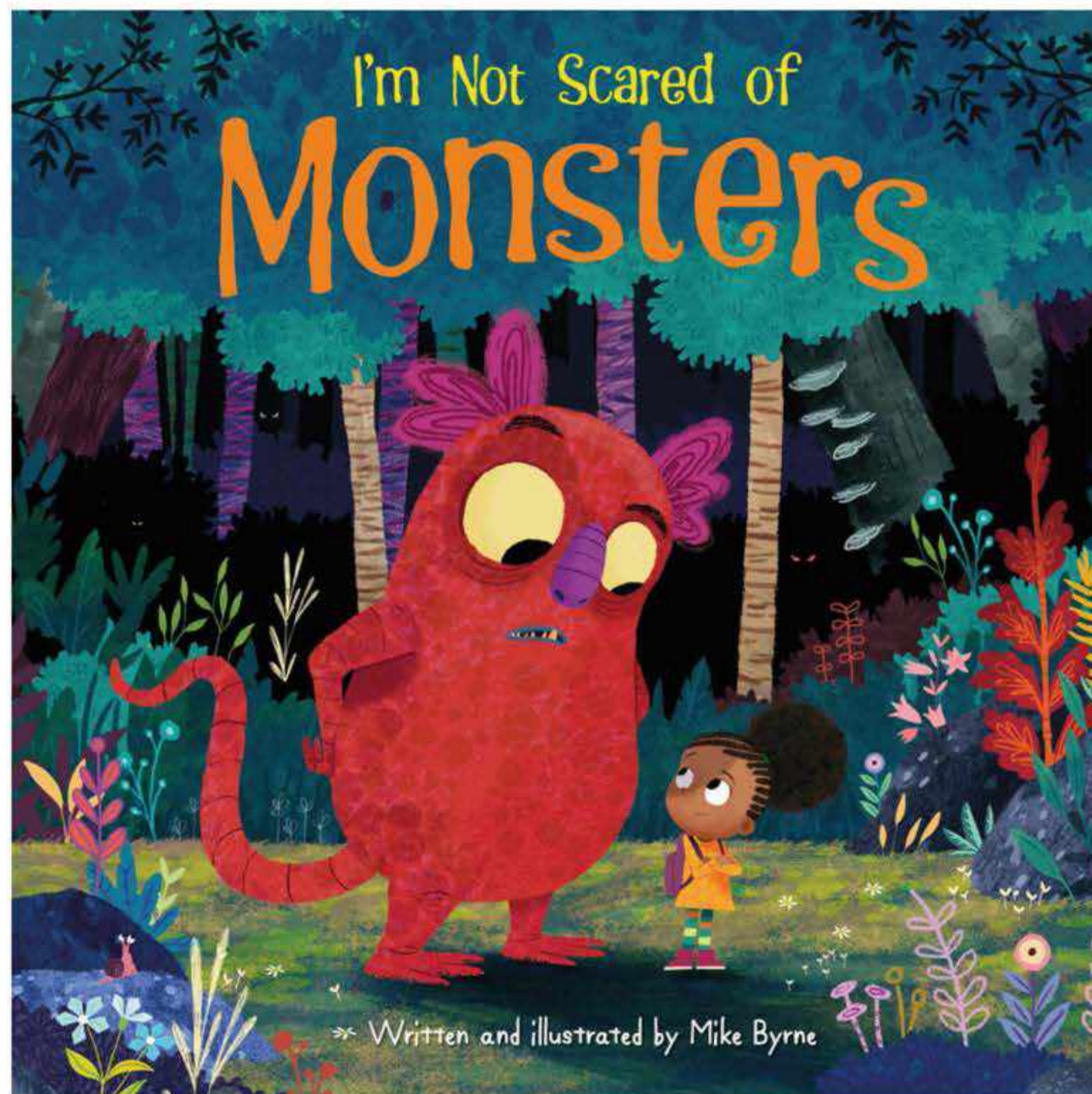
Lanced-nose Chameleon:

The jeweled chameleon is named for its amazing ornate design.

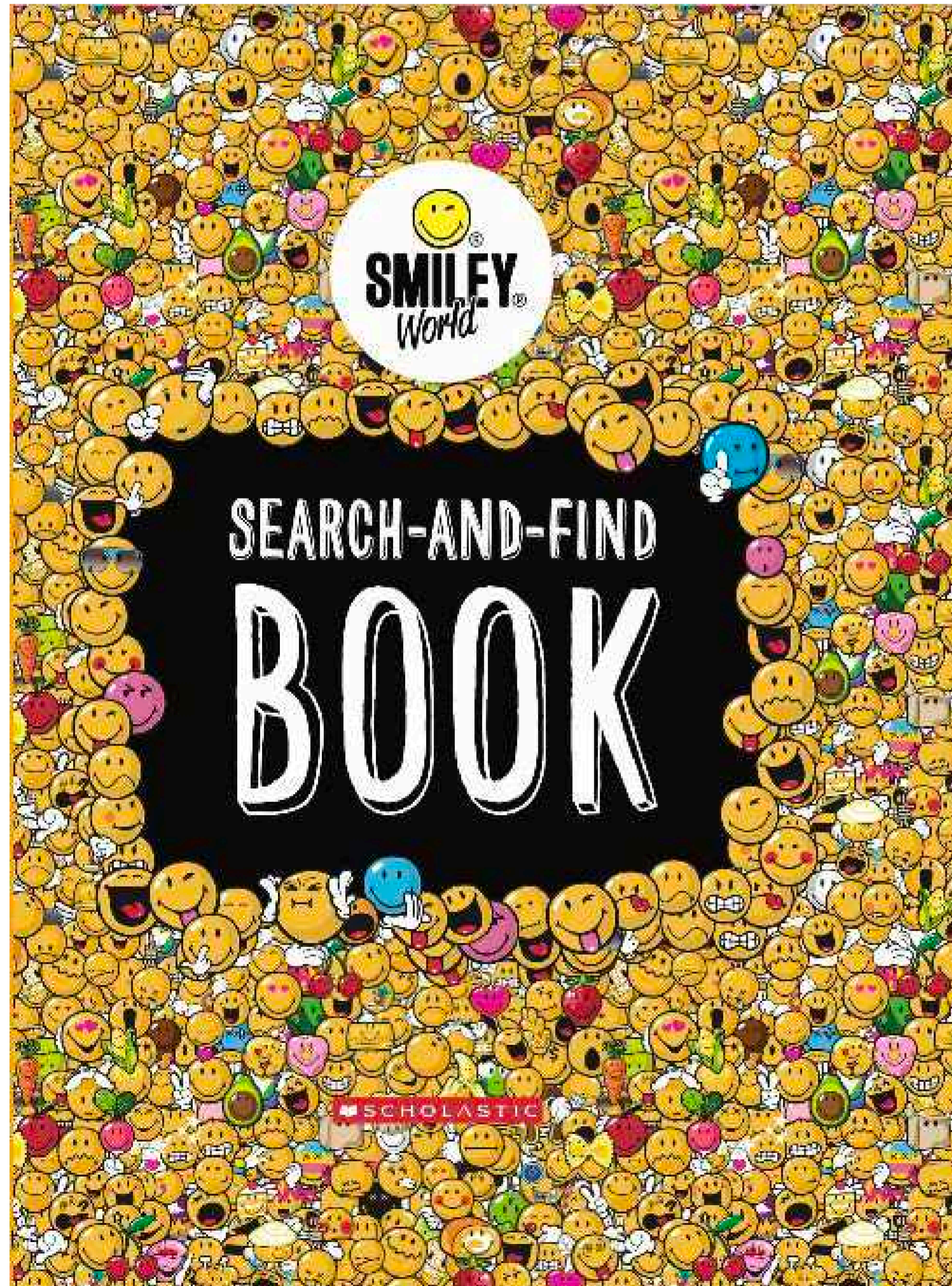
Veiled Chameleon:

The largest living chameleon on Earth grows to about twenty-seven inches long including its tail.

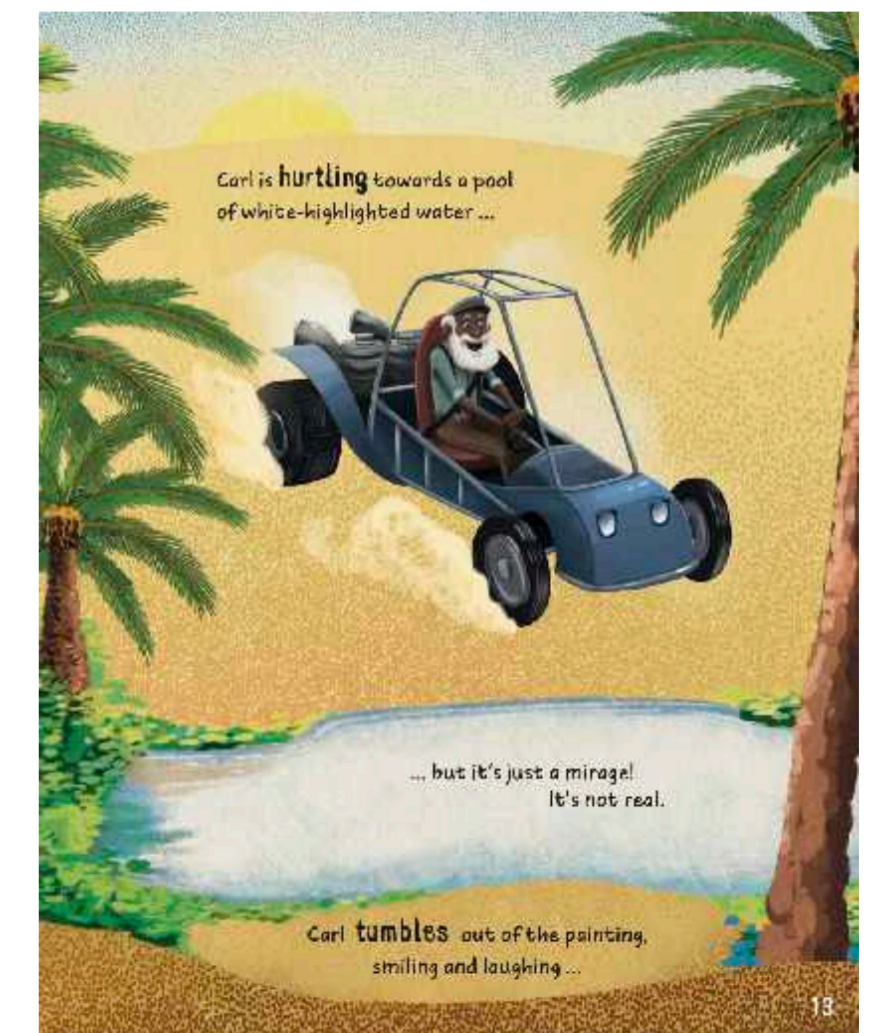
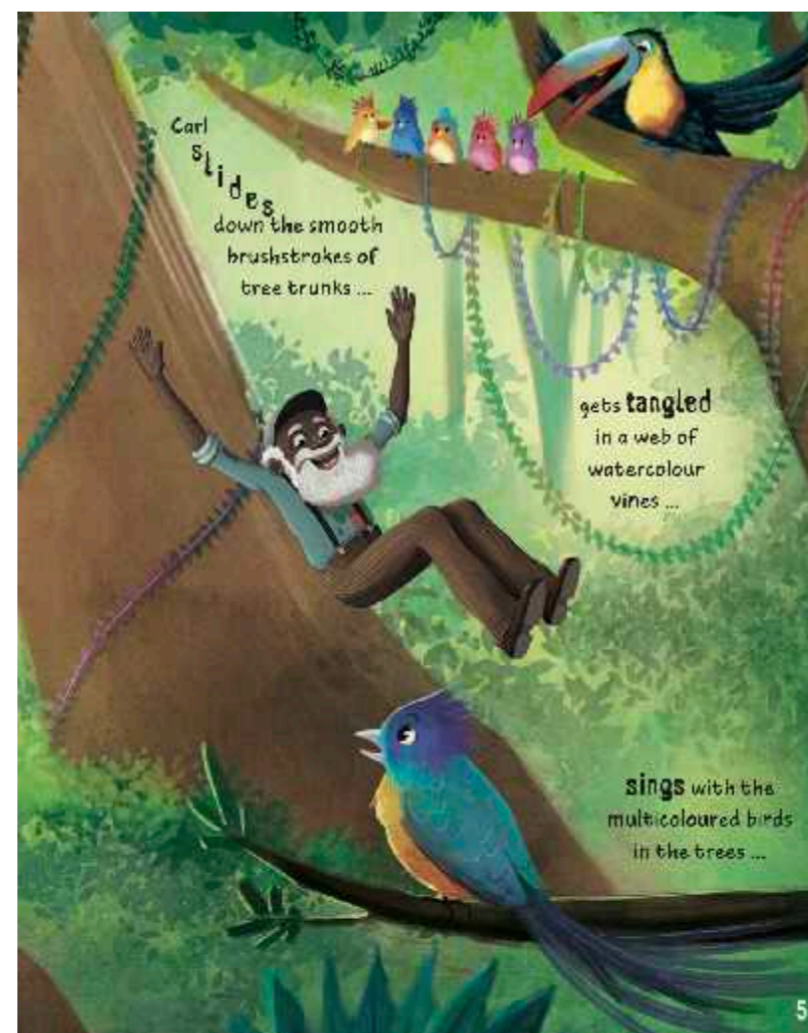
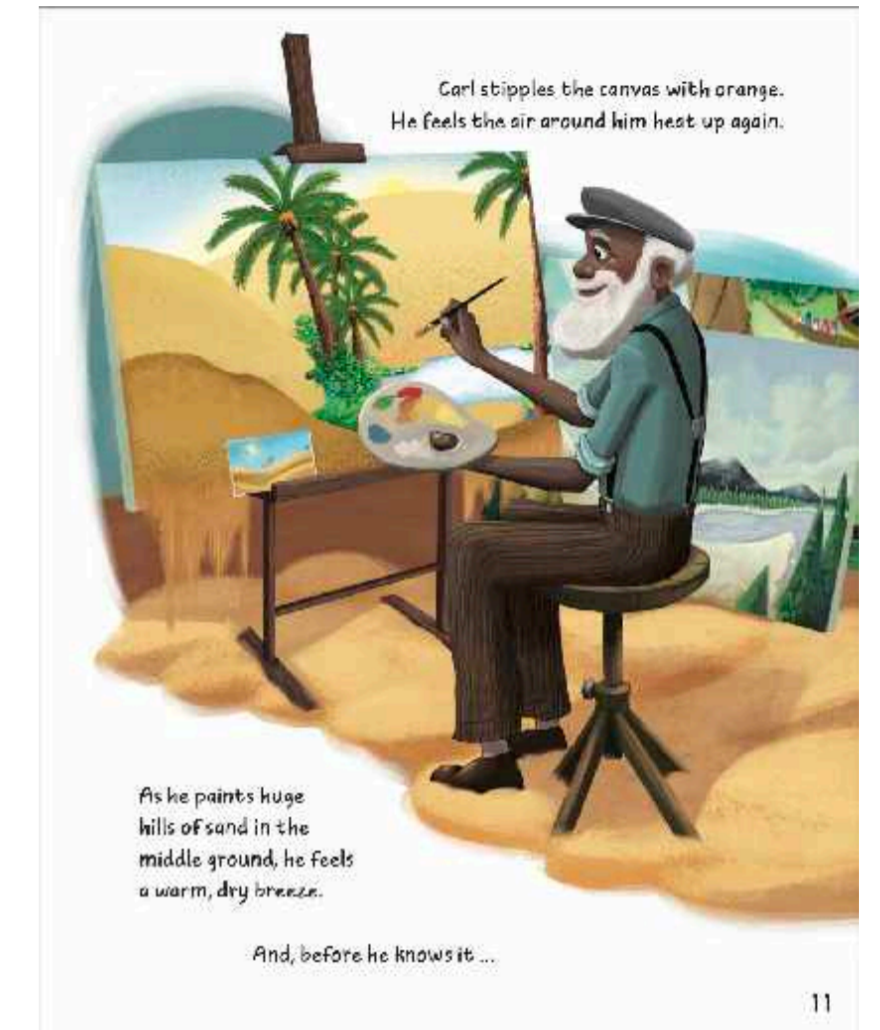
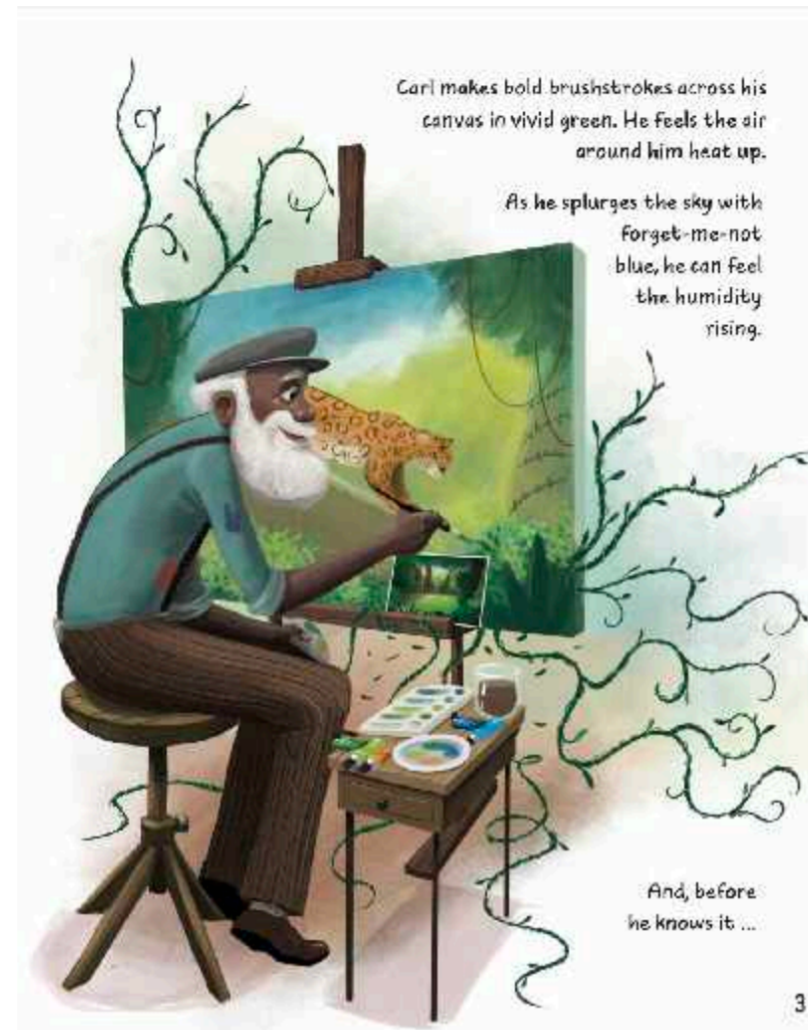
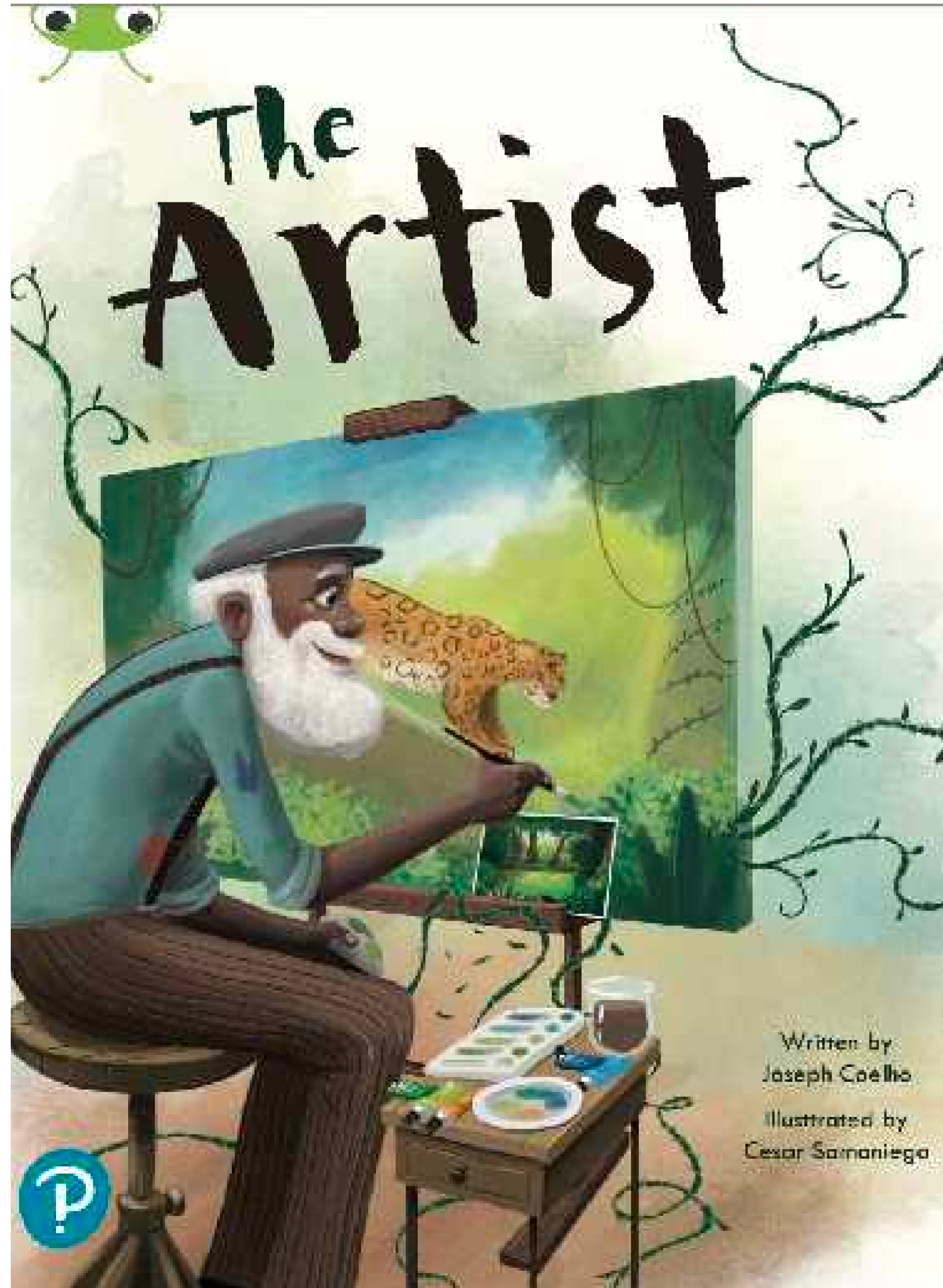
